TOILETS

A step-by-step guide for effective maintenance

Keeping your toilet clean is not only essential for your daily hygiene, but also to ensure the longevity of your bathroom. Whether you are doing daily touch-ups or tackling a deep clean, following the right steps to clean your toilet helps prevent damage and keeps it sparkling!

STEP 1: PREPARE THE TOILET FOR CLEANING

Before you begin cleaning, start by removing the toilet seat. This allows you to clean those hard to reach areas, and also protects the seat from any harsh cleaning agents that may be used and damage the seat.

STEP 2: CLEAN THE TOILET SEAT

Using mild, non-abrasive products, wipe the surface with a soft, damp cloth and a mild detergent. Avoid using alcohol-based solvents or bleach, especially on wooden or delicate finishes.

Promptly after cleaning, dry the seat with a soft cloth to avoid any water damage from occurring.

Special tips for wooden toilet seats

Wood is a much more porous material than plastic, meaning it can absorb more moisture and therefore bacteria. Most wooden toilet seats are coated with a varnish or enamel, but harsh chemicals such as bleach can wear this off and expose the raw wood underneath. This is why it is of the utmost importance to ensure you are using the correct cleaning products for wooden designs.

Only use warm, soapy water applied with a damp cloth (ensure it is not soaking wet)

Do not expose the seat to direct sunlight

Keep the toilet away from heat sources such as radiators or air conditioners if possible

TIP: If you are using a strong cleaner inside the toilet bowl, ensure the seat is either removed or protected until the bowl is entirely dry, in order to protect the material.

STEP 3: CLEAN THE TOILET PAN (BOWL AND EXTERIOR)

Daily Cleaning:

Flush immediately after use to prevent any buildup or stains.

Wipe any water droplets from the seat or surrounding areas using a soft, lint-free cloth to avoid limescale from forming

Weekly/Monthly Cleaning:

Use a neutral, toilet safe cleaner to clean the bowl's exterior surfaces, edges and interior. Avoid products with strong acids or abrasive particles, as they can scratch ceramic or stone surfaces.

Using a low acid solution, such as heavily diluted citric acid, clean the ceramic or stone bowl to remove any buildup and prevent staining.

Limescale Removal:

For stubborn limescale, use a dedicated toilet safe limescale remover.

Allow to sit for 10-15 minutes, then gently scrub and flush.

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IMPORTANT SAFETY AND MAINTENANCE TIPS

Avoid in-tank cleaners, especially those containing chlorine, as they can corrode tank fittings, causing leaks and potential water damage.

Never use abrasive chemicals or disinfectants directly on the seat or ceramic/stone parts of the toilet. Do not scrub ceramic or stone surfaces with any sharp tools, as this can damage the texture and glaze - therefore reducing the bowl's stain resistance.

Keep your bathroom properly ventilated to prevent any damp or mold growth.

By following our cleaning guidelines, you will keep your toilet area sanitary and in excellent condition without damaging any of the materials.

To keep your Lusso toilet clean and well-maintained, start by removing the seat to access hard-to-reach areas and protect it from harsh chemicals.

Clean the seat with a soft cloth and mild detergent - avoid bleach or abrasive products, especially on wooden finishes. For daily care, flush regularly and wipe away water to prevent limescale.

Weekly, use a neutral cleaner on all surfaces, and monthly, apply a low-acid solution like diluted citric acid to remove buildup. For stubborn limescale, use a mix of white vinegar and citric acid. Avoid in-tank cleaners, sharp tools, or harsh chemicals on ceramic, stone or seat surfaces, and ensure proper bathroom ventilation to prevent mold and moisture damage.
