WOODEN MIRRORS

A step-by-step guide for effective maintenance

Proper care and cleaning will help to maintain the beauty and longevity of your wooden mirror. It is important to remember that wood is a porous material, meaning that it can absorb much more moisture and bacteria than other materials. Most wooden items are coated with a varnish or enamel, but harsh chemicals such as bleach can wear this down, exposing the raw wood underneath. This is why it is of the utmost importance to ensure you are using the correct cleaning products for wooden designs. Follow the steps below to preserve both the wooden frame and the glass.

CLEANING THE WOODEN FRAME

Use a soft, damp cloth to gently wipe down the wooden surface. Ensure the cloth is not soaking, as this will soak into the wood.

Do not use strong detergents or abrasive cleaners, such as bleach as this can damage the surface and texture of the wood.

After cleaning, immediately dry the surface with a clean, dry cloth to prevent any moisture damage Avoid excessive water or prolonged contact with high levels of moisture, as this can affect the wood over periods of time.

CLEANING THE MIRROR GLASS

Use a clean, lint-free cloth with a glass or window cleaner.

Do not use any substances containing abrasives, as this can scratch the glass.

Spray the cleaner directly onto the cloth rather than the mirror itself - this not only evenly disperses the product but also avoids any runoff that may damage the wooden frame.

Use circular motions to gently clean until streak free.

OUR TIPS

Clean regularly to avoid build-ups of dust, grime and stains.

Ensure good ventilation within your bathroom space to reduce any condensation and humidity that may cause damage to your wood products.

To keep your Lusso wooden mirror looking its best, it's important to clean it properly using gentle methods.

Since wood is porous and sensitive to moisture, avoid harsh chemicals like bleach that can damage its finish. For the wooden frame, use a soft, damp cloth (not soaking) to wipe it down, then dry it immediately with a clean cloth.

Avoid excess water and prolonged exposure to moisture. For the mirror glass, use a lint-free cloth and spray a gentle glass cleaner onto the cloth - not directly onto the mirror - to prevent runoff that could harm the wood. Wipe in circular motions until streak-free.

Regular cleaning and good ventilation will help prevent dust build-up and moisture damage over time.
