

Cleaning & Care - Cast Iron

Your cast iron bath should last a lifetime given the correct aftercare is provided. Your bath contains an enamel coating for enhanced durability - which has many of the same qualities as glass - including its tough structure that's easy to clean.

What you will need:

Non-abrasive cleaner or soap
Soft sponge or cloth
Soft towel

How to clean your cast iron bath:

Step 1:

By setting your tub with a hot temperature before cleaning, you will make it easier to clean. Do this by filling your tub with 3-4 inches of hot water and rotating it around the tub. Leave this for several minutes and drain the water.

Step 2:

Use two tablespoons of cast iron non-abrasive cleaner and mix it with one gallon of hot water.

Step 3:

Gently rub the surface with a hot sponge or cloth.

Step 4:

Rinse out the bathtub with hot water to make sure no residue of the cleaner is left behind.

Step 5:

Dry your cast iron bath using a soft cloth or towel.

DO:



Use a soft sponge or cloth



Fill your tub with hot water before cleaning



Use a soft cloth or towel to dry

DON'T:



Use abrasive cleaning materials or scouring pads on your bath



Use acidic products
